TRAVELING TEAL SHOE DISPLAY



We are painting these shoes Teal to represent each of the NBK survivors of sexual violence who have decided to make a restricted or unrestricted report of sexual assault during FY 16. One in 3 women and 1 in 6 men will experience sexual abuse during their lifetime. We can't stop what we can't talk about, stomp out sexual assault.

TEAL RIBBONS



Throughout the month of April, you will see Teal Ribbons. April is Sexual Assault Awareness and Prevention Month (SAAPM). During April, people raise awareness about sexual violence and how to prevent it. Teal is the official color of SAAPM. The teal ribbon is the symbol of sexual violence prevention.

Denim Day

The Denim Day campaign was originally initiated in response to a ruling by the Italian Supreme Court where a rape conviction was overturned because the Justices felt that since the victim was wearing tight jeans she must have helped her rapist remove her jeans, thereby implying consent. The following day, the women in the Italian Parliament came to work wearing jeans in solidarity with the victim. Now, 17 years later, wearing jeans on Denim Day has become an international symbol of protest against erroneous and destructive attitudes about sexual assault. Denim Day is Wednesday, April 26, 2017!
